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A NOTE FROM PASTOR JENNIFER

Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, just as it is well with your soul. – 3 John 1:2

As we conclude the October preaching series on "Caring for Our Congregation," I've been reminded recently of the importance of caring for oneself. Just as we are called to care for one another, we are also called to care for our own mind, body, and spirit. It is not possible for us to care for others well if we aren't caring for ourselves first. Caring for others takes a great capacity of time, energy, and empathy. There is no room for caring for others if we're starting from empty in our own lives.

One way to assess whether we are caring for ourselves is to ask ourselves John Wesley's famous question, "How is it with your soul?" Wesley wasn't asking "How is it with your spouse's soul?" or, "How is it with your child's soul?" He is inviting us to do the hard (and sometimes painful work) of reflecting on our own lives. I suspect if there are parts of our lives that are out of alignment – failing to eat well or move our bodies, not spending time with God, or missing out on activities that give us life – our souls probably aren't well.

As we move closer to the holiday season, you are encouraged to care for yourselves. Do the work of reflecting on your life and examine those areas where you can care for yourself better. It can be hard work. It may be overwhelming. But it is such important work. Anxiety will be reduced, gratitude comes easier, and relationships will be strengthened. So, I ask, "how is it with your soul?"

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ADULT DISCIPLESHIP & SPIRITUAL FORMATION OPPORTUNITIES

CONGREGATIONAL CARE MINISTER TRAINING - Join us as we train our first class of Congregational Care Ministers (CCm's). CCm's are lay people (you all) who work alongside pastors and Stephen Ministers to provide quality care for our church community. As with most faith communities, our congregation has needs that all of us will need to work together in meeting. We are called in our baptismal vows to support one another, and this training is a way to begin the process of creating a network of care. All are welcome to participate in this training. WITH HELPFUL SUGGESTIONS FROM COSMOLOGY, CHRISTOLOGY, ETC. - is a 6 session mini course, multi-media presentation using power point, DVDs, songs, art work, visual bibliographies, and lots of handouts. The purpose of this "mini-course" is to present and interweave the three areas (cosmology, Christology, and personal understandings of "How Big Is Your God?"). The goal is to present and/or nurture a broader, deeper and more holistic perception of God (our God is truly a BIG and awesome God). Your perception/conception of God will grow! A "working" understanding of cosmology will be taught, together with our role as caretakers of our earth. In the 21st century some people have tried to separate God and science, but the focus here will be quite different and demonstrate the increasing compatibility of the two. Don't miss it this time!

The mini-course has been successfully presented to over 100 people in 17 different groups/churches/institutes over the last four years. WOULD YOU LIKE TO KNOW MORE ABOUT MANAGING YOUR FINANCES AND STRATEGIES FOR MAKING CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS?

Join us on **November 10 at 9:00 to 11:30 a.m.** at Church of the Master when our Finance Committee is hosting a financial workshop.

A few months back, our committee reviewed an article from Smart Church Management on "Things an Effective Church Finance Committee" should be doing. One thing the article listed was to provide training on handling personal finances for the members. If you find yourself a little short of funds at the end of the month and struggle to make the charitable contributions you desire, please plan to join us.

There will be three elements covered at the workshop. We will look at how the new tax law may impact your tax return for those who have itemized deductions in the past. We will talk about strategies for making a household budget that focuses on priorities. And the last element will cover some ideas on legacy giving.

Our workshop presenter will be Barbara Fillion. Barbara is a member of Hyde Park Community UMC in Cincinnati. She is retired from Procter & Gamble, and has worked as a tax preparer at H&R Block and Mackey Advisors.

With her husband, John, Barbara has taught budgeting classes for over 20 years at HPCUMC, has led the Crown Biblical Financial Study, has taught budgeting for guests at Interfaith Hospitality Network of Cincinnati, and has led a "Clergy Personal Finance" session at the first two Clergy Crucible courses.

At Hyde Park Community UMC, Barbara leads the Community Ministries & Global Outreach (Missions) Team and has previously served as Secretary of the Board of Trustees and as a cochair for the church's annual stewardship campaign. She is also a member of two Conference Committees, Council on Development and Board of Pensions & Health Benefits.

Barbara's passions are stewardship, networking to make a difference, and travel. She has recently become more actively involved in state & local political races. She has completed 2 full marathons, raising funds for Team in Training, and numerous half marathons and shorter races (her race goal is always to finish "upright & smiling, before the course closes".
