A Letter from the Pastor Written by Pastor Jay Anderson

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

I shared with you last month my plans to attend the Church of the Resurrection Leadership Institute in Kansas City prior to Lynn and I taking a week of vacation in Arizona at the end of September and into October. This month I want to reflect on that time with you a bit.

As I shared previously, the COR Leadership Institute is an annual event hosted by Rev. Adam Hamilton at the largest United Methodist Church in our denomination, Church of the Resurrection, with over 22,000 members. Typically this event is open to anyone from any denomination to come in and attend workshops and teachings about church leadership at all levels (I would love to take a team of leaders from Church of the Master to this event next year!). However, with all that is happening within our denomination right now around issues of human sexuality, they limited the scope of the institute this year to just United Methodists and how we might move forward as a denomination. The group was largely, but not exclusively, made up of those who fall within the Centrist-Progressive part of the church who believe that our denomination should stay together, and that we should be open and affirming of full rights for LGBTQIA+ people within the denomination. I should add here that within the United States, that is the position held by the large majority of United Methodists and that it is only when looked at in the context of world Methodism that that is not the case.

We spent much time hearing from speakers who have somehow been impacted or hurt by the church's current position and language on human sexuality as well as from those who cast a bright vision for what the church might look like in the future.

Among the issues that were raised throughout the conference was the crisis of suicide in general, but especially as it relates to young LGBTQIA+ people who were being bullied, or worse, tortured in school, and/or rejected by both their family and their church. These young people, feeling they have nowhere to turn, are taking their own lives at an alarming rate. One of the things Hamilton pleaded with us as pastors to do when we returned to our churches was to address the issue of suicide in some way - through a sermon or series, a study, or by connecting with a local organization who provides counseling services in our own communities. I brought home a couple of resource materials with me in order to do that very thing, knowing that we have LGBTQIA+ friends and family in our congregation as well as in our community.

Of course, as you all know, our family was struck by the tragedy of suicide in a very personal way just days after we returned from a wonderful vacation, when one of our sons-in-law took his own life. In our case, we didn't see or recognize the signs of mental illness and/or depression until it was too late. And while we knew that there were issues that Jeff and our daughter were working through, the fact is they were working on them, they were making progress towards resolving the stresses in their marriage. That is one of the things that makes this all the more tragic for everyone involved. Things were turning around for them, so nobody knows what suddenly snapped in Jeff's mind or his thinking that made him resort to a permanent solution to a temporary problem. And unfortunately, we'll likely never understand. That is the nature of mental illness and depression when it goes unrecognized or undiagnosed. And it is a tragedy.


Our West Ohio Conference recognizes the tragedy that suicide is, especially to our youth and young people, and is offering a Suicide Prevention Workshop at Stoney Brook United Methodist Church on November 17th at 2:30 p.m., in cooperation with our friends at Ohio Health. The Workshop is geared towards youth, youth workers, and parents, but is open to all. There is no cost to attend the workshop, but registration is required. You can find more information and can register through the West Ohio Conference website, www.westohioumc.org.

On a personal note, Lynn and I cannot thank you all enough for all the ways in which you have carried us through these last few weeks since that tragic day on October 9th. Your prayers, cards, kind words, and gifts of food have lifted us and sustained us in ways you'll never fully know. Our family has dealt with tragedy before, and we know that we will get through this with time. But we also know that one of the ways we all get through these times of trouble is that, as the band U2 says in their song One, "we get to carry each other."

Thank you for carrying, and caring for us during this time,



Earlier this year, Pastor Jay began a staff meeting by asking us how we begin our day. Do we check our phones as soon as we get up, do we fix a cup of coffee, check the news, or maybe exercise? Pastor Jay challenged each of us to be a bit more purposeful about how

we frame our day and how spending time with God first thing in the morning might shape our day in a different way. As I pondered this and reflected on my daily routines, I

began to think about how we begin the day with our kids. How do we frame their days? Are there ways that we could be more purposeful about that time in the morning? Are we sending our kids out the door with a little bit of Jesus to carry them through the day? With this in mind, I started the school year with a new morning devotional for my kids. The book "Our Daily Bread for Kids – 365 Meaningful Moments with God" by Crystal

Bowman & Teri McKinely has been a wonderful resource for our family. The book is written primarily for elementary age children and includes a simple devotion for every day of the year. (There is also a preschool version "Our Daily Bread for Preschoolers – 90

Big Moments With God.") I love how this devotion is strongly rooted in God's Word. Each day begins with a Bible verse (always from a translation that makes the verse easy to understand for the children.) The devotion for the day highlights the Bible verse and then helps the children apply it to their lives in a practical way. Each day includes a "fun fact"

(which my boys love!!) and a "Read More" section to extend their learning. This is especially good for older children. We are still figuring out the right time to fit this in as part of our morning routine. Sometimes we read it together at breakfast, sometimes we gather on the couch and sometimes I read it sitting in the driveway (while they are all strapped in their car seats and not bothering each other!) While that piece is still a work in progress, I do see a difference as we take this time to focus together on God in the morning. Our day IS framed in a different way.

Do you have a devotion that you enjoy reading as a family? Let's share our ideas and encourage each other to point our families towards God each step of the way.




Caroline O'Connor


Master Mutt's Stuffing Party
