A Letter from the Pastor Written by Pastor Jay Anderson

As I write this article I am preparing to do two things: 1) attend the Church of the Resurrection Leadership Institute in Kansas City, KS, and 2) go on vacation. A little about each...

Each year, Adam Hamilton, the Lead Pastor at Church of the Resurrection, hosts a leadership institute where hundreds, if not thousands, of clergy and laity come to learn and train on how to be better, more effective leaders in the church today. This is an ecumenical offering and hosts people from across all denominations and theological perspectives. I have never had the opportunity to attend before, but it has long been on my "bucket list." (Yes, I can be a bit of a clergy nerd about things like that!) This year, however, because of all that is going on in the United Methodist denomination, the Leadership Institute has been tailored to what is needed in United Methodist congregations at this pivotal time, and is open only to United Methodist clergy and laity to attend. The institute/conference will serve as a gathering place for the larger, centrist-progressive wing of the church who seeks to keep the denomination together as best we can, but as one that is welcoming to all and affirming of God's call to our LGBTQIA+ brothers and sisters in ministry. I expect that during this conference we will review the legislation that UMNext, the name of the centrist-progressive coalition, has submitted for consideration at the next General Conference, along with that of the other groups who have submitted legislation pertaining to the future of the church. I would also expect that there will be conversations about how to bring this information back to local congregations to help everyone there to understand what is going on. And of course, that is what I would plan on doing anyway.

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And I say all of that in order to affirm what I offered in this space last month - regardless of what happens at General Conference 2020 in May, I am confident that there WILL be an expression of United Methodism that will reflect who we are as a congregation - loving, welcoming, serving, and affirming God's call in ALL of our lives as beloved children of God. I'll share more with you after I return from Kansas City. Immediately following the leadership institute, Lynn and I are leaving for a week of vacation to Sedona, AZ. I shared with you in my very first sermon that I have what I call a "theology of vacation," in that I plan my time away in a very systematic way in order to provide the level of rest, relaxation, and renewal that I know I need in order to best serve you as your pastor. I feel like we've had a very good first three months together since I started on June 30 - you have all been wonderfully supportive of Lynn and I as we have begun our time together. We have had several wonderful opportunities to meet with folks, primarily through supper clubs so far, and look forward to continuing to meet more of you in small groups this fall. And we also are very much enjoying the chance to sing in our wonderful chancel choir. Thanks to Chris and all of the choir for welcoming us in and allowing us to make joyful noise together! I'm sure that when we return for World Communion Sunday on October 6th and our October message series on Communion, we will be nicely rested and ready to head into the next three months with all the energy that Fall and soon, Advent, will require of us. We appreciate your prayers while we are away. In my absence, should any kind of pastoral care issue arise, please reach out to Kristina in the office. Rev. Jim Wagner has kindly agreed to fill in for me in case of any pastoral care emergencies, since we currently are without an Associate Pastor. Our visitation team is also ready to jump in as needed.




