A Letter from the Pastor

I have been very intentional in my choices around sermon series topics as I begin my time here with you at Church of the Master. I began with a series on Grace because our Christian faith, in the Wesleyan tradition, begins and ends with God's grace and ends with God's grace. I have moved on to a series about prayer in general and the Lord's Prayer in particular, because I believe that prayer is probably the most basic of the Spiritual Disciplines with which we engage our faith, even if our only time of prayer is on a Sunday morning in worship. Open and honest prayer that God's will, not our will be done is a sign of a maturing faith. We will move next to a series on Holy Communion because it is as we commune around Christ's table that we symbolically take Christ into ourselves (we are what we eat) in order to participate actively in the grace of God given to us in the body and blood of Jesus Christ. Grace - Prayer - Communion; a trinity of Traditions of our faith that bring us together as the Body of Christ.

And I believe these unifying things are important for us to reengage with on a regular basis because there are many other things that seek to or result in our being pushed apart. Our denomination is dealing with some of those potentially divisive things right now as we struggle, as every other mainline denomination has struggled, over the issue of human sexuality and how we are to faithfully minister with and to our LGBTQIA+ brothers and sisters. In many ways it's all an argument akin to the one about how many angels can dance on the head of a pin. And I don't say that to minimize the importance of the issues at hand, but rather to suggest that, at the local congregational level, the impact of a decision one way or another is likely to be minimal. And here's why I say that.

Have you personally ever met one of our Bishops? Have you personally ever been a part of one of our General Boards? Have you personally gone to one of our international mission sites in Mexico, Congo, Russia, Vietnam, or elsewhere? For 99.9% of our congregation, the answer is going to be, "no." For most United Methodists in the world today, our connection with and our context for life as a United Methodist is local - it's the people we know and love from the pew next to us in our local church. If we would sit and talk about our "church family," nearly all of us would list the people we serve in ministry with, sing next to in the choir, or attend Sunday school with as our "church family." When we discuss our family's "church life," our conversation is almost always local in nature - Sunday School, VBS, what our kids are doing, how much we liked the choir anthem, etc. - as opposed to the latest decision by the Judicial Council, World Methodist Federation, or the General Board of Discipleship.

And my point is this: regardless of what happens at the denominational level, we are still the body of Christ in this place, with these people, in this community. If the denomination decides at General Conference 2020 to split into 2 or 3 or 70 different denominations, we will still be the same church family who has met in this building continually for going on two centuries, doing ministry in the name of Jesus Christ, with and for the community that surrounds us. The money we put in the offering plate each week will continue, as it does now, to make a much larger impact for the ministry we do right here and for other communities in need around the world than it does for any denominational structure that comes out of a separation. When we decide to withhold our offerings or direct them into specific places - essentially using them as a weapon - the only people who are impacted by that are us, through cuts to ministry, salaries and staffing, or outreach programs that enable us to be the hands and feet of Christ with our church family in our community.

A Letter from the Pastor, continued

When we decide to leave the church out of protest, the United Methodist Church as a denomination, honestly, doesn't know the difference. Your church family, though, those with whom you have shared a pew, served alongside, or broken bread, feel your loss deep within their bones - they grieve your departure as they would grieve a death.

And that's why I intentionally began by preaching grace, moving to prayer, and then continuing with communion. It matters much less to me by what name we call ourselves than it does that our faith in and discipleship of Jesus Christ is known in how we are with others, how we love one another. God's grace is God's grace and is available to us all, regardless of what denominational name is stenciled on our offering envelopes or painted on our sign. Regardless of any decision made at a General Conference next year, we will still celebrate the love of Jesus Christ, the unmerited grace by which we receive salvation, we will still pray the Lord's Prayer, and we will still gather around Christ's table to receive the bread of life, given to us by Jesus the Christ. I dare say, worship from one Sunday to the next will look no different. The only difference will be in our hearts; do we extend to others the grace, the prayers, and the community that was offered to us, or do we make a decision that some are not worthy of being in community with us. The United Methodist Church at large has always been what we call a "big tent," where people who hold different beliefs about different aspects of our faith can come together and be the church regardless of those differences. I know that whatever happens on the other side of the next General Conference, there will be a "big tent" expression of Methodism that will come out of it, where people of diverse backgrounds and beliefs can continue to worship and celebrate, pray and serve, and share the body of Christ at the table together, as a church family. That's where I will be - I hope you will be too!

Sunday School

Join us for Children's Sunday school from 9:30-10:30 a.m. on Sunday mornings. All children age 3 through fifth graders gather in the Movie Room upstairs at 9:30 a.m. for a time of singing and fellowship. The preschool/kindergartners then transition downstairs to Room 8 and the 1st-5th graders move to room 17 for their lesson. We will be using the brand new Bible Story Basics curriculum. The children will work their way through the Bible over the course of three years using stories, games, music, drama, puzzles and more.

Rainbows and Dewdrops

Rainbows and Dewdrops are the Children's Church programs held during the 11:00 a.m. worship service. Rainbows is for children in 1st-3rd grade while Dewdrops is for 3 year olds-kindergarten. All children are invited to begin the worship service with their families, participate in the Children's Moment during the service and then follow their teachers to their classrooms. Dewdrops is held in Room 8 downstairs and Rainbows is held in Room 17 upstairs. We will be using the Deep Blue Curriculum during this time. Our theme for the year is, "Loving God, Loving Neighbor."

“When Kids Come Out”

A Four-Session Class for Parents of LGBTQ Children

When a child comes out to his/her/their family, it often raises many questions for both the child and for the family.

For example:

- What does it mean for the family when a child comes out to his/her/their parents?
- What does it mean for the parents’ relationship to their church?
- What does it mean for the parents’ own faith? •How do parents navigate their own “coming out” after their children have come out to them?
- What do I/we need to know as parents of an LGBTQ child with the actions of the General Conference in St. Louis?

The sessions are designed to provide a safe space where questions and concerns can be dealt with openly and honestly. These questions are among those that will be addressed in the four-session class that will be held on Wednesday evenings: September 18, September 25, October 2, October 9. The class will be held at the Worthington United Methodist Church. The meetings will begin at 7:00 p.m. and conclude by 8:30 pm. The church is located at 600 High Street, Worthington. Parking is available at the church. Look for signs directing you to “When Kids Come Out” class. The Rev. Jim Waugh, retired pastor in the West Ohio Conference, will lead the group. Jim and his wife, Carol, have an adult daughter, Lisa, who came out to them several years ago.

What's new around the building?

We hope you've noticed the new signs on the outside of the building and at the entrance to the parking lot. Shawn Foster was kind enough to re-route the air conditioner condenser pipe into the downspout so we no longer have a water barrel on the south side of the building. Thank you, Shawn!

Three new air conditioner units were installed by our HVAC maintenance contractor, G Mechanical, in rooms 17, 18 & 19 upstairs. These will be more energy efficient than the 20 year old units they replaced, one of which did not operate at all. We were able to purchase these three units for the price of two.

The re-leathering of one rank of organ pipes was completed in August by our technicians at Muller Organ. Ask Chris what re-leathering means.

We have had an energy audit to plan for replacing all the lights in the building with LED bulbs. This will qualify us for a rebate from the City of Westerville as well as future cost savings on electricity. The project is divided into two parts – the sanctuary and the remainder of the building. We are closer to beginning the work as we consult with Northern Lighting, Neff Event Lighting and Countryside Electric.

An updated Emergency Preparedness Plan is being finalized with the Trustees and hope to get it implemented and publicized to the congregation after Administrative Council approval.
